

These are the human rights (“basic rights”) that are being willfully and routinely violated by “*public authorities*” in Germany, and also by the European Court of Human Rights:

Article 1 paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of the Deutsches Grundgesetz (Germany’s Basic Law -- GG), Article 2 paragraphs 1 and 2 GG, Article 3 paragraphs 1 and 3 GG, Article 10 paragraphs 1 and 2 GG, Article 13 paragraphs 1 and 2 GG, Article 14 paragraphs 1 and 3 GG, Article 17 GG, Article 18 GG, Article 19 paragraphs 1, 2 and 4 GG, Article 20 paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 GG, Article 21 GG, Article 24 GG, Article 79 paragraph 3 GG, Article 93 paragraph 1 (4)a GG, Article 101 paragraph 1 GG, Article 103 paragraphs 1 and 2 GG, Article 104 paragraph 1 GG, Article 146 GG, Article 1 of the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR), Article 5 paragraph (1) c ECHR, Article 8 ECHR, Article 13 ECHR, Article 14 ECHR, Article 17 ECHR, and Article 18 ECHR. **This is not intended as an exhaustive list of the rights being violated.**

NOTE: The rights listed above include the rights to be governed in accordance with the social and international democratic order which has been established by the German people in their Deutsches Grundgesetz (GG) and in the corresponding (duplicate) rights that have been provided for in the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR). These rights also correspond to the “inviolable” rights provided for in the Treaty of Lisbon Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union, and the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
